HOW TO CREATE A SUCCESSFUL CONCEPT MAP IN 7 EASY STEPS

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How to Create a Successful Concept Map - 7 Easy Steps

- 1. Determine what "**Focus Question**" or "Key Concept" you want answered. You have to clearly define the focus of the concept map.
- Create a "Parking Lot" of ideas this is a bulleted list of everything you think about when you consider the elements of the focus question or your key concept. This is the brainstorming time.
- 3. **Prioritize or organize info**. Many of the ideas will not leave the parking lot and get on the concept map. The parking lot ideas are prioritized. These become the sub-concepts on the concept map
- 4. Arrange the sub-concepts around central concept that is logical and makes sense to the learner.
- 5. Draw lines with arrows to connect sub-concepts. Using lines, connect shapes (sub-concepts) linking them together (propositions)...words on the lines describe relationship determines the relationships between the concepts.
- 6. Label the lines with words that show the relationship between the two sub-concepts. This is often difficult to do but important to demonstrate WHAT the relationships are between the concepts.
- 7. Make a key that guides the viewer into understanding what the shapes and colors mean.
